DOM Thoughts

Matthew 6:31-32 "Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things."

Have you ever forgotten something? It seems like every time our family goes on a trip, something gets left behind. Most of the time it is an item that is easily replaceable like a toothbrush or some other item that is quickly procured. Other times we forget something much more important. During 2020 when we were going back and forth to Shands for Silas's chemo, one time I forgot my medicine. It would have been extremely difficult for me to run out and get several prescription drugs along with some vitamins that I take. Thankfully, our oldest son was home, so he met me outside of Valdosta with my medicine. From that moment forward, Laurie always asks me, "do you have your medicine?"

Have you ever wondered if God forgot something? We trust that He forgets our confessed sin, but what about other things? Does God forget that we need food, clothing, and shelter? Is it possible that the God who created the universe and created us with a need for food would at some point forget that fact? Our need for clothing and shelter is a result of the fall, but our need to eat was present before Adam and Eve sinned.

Is it possible that the Lord would somehow misplace this fact? Jesus tells us it is not possible. He tells us that our heavenly Father knows we need all these things. Yet so many of us worry about these exact things. We might never say, "I think God has forgotten that I need to eat." But, we live like we think exactly that.

Furthermore, many of us will say proudly that we are trusting God for eternity. That we believe God has prepared a home for us in a place we call heaven. That we will be in His presence once we depart from this life. We trust Him, for eternity.... but we doubt Him for tomorrow. I often ponder how odd that is. It would seem to me a much more difficult thing to prepare a place and provide for me in eternity, than it would be to do so during this short span we call life. Yet, I rarely worry about my eternal future, but frequently am concerned about my present needs. Am I really saying that God isn't big enough, strong enough, wise enough to handle both?

So, I want to encourage you, as I encourage myself, "do not worry, only have faith." We can trust God, because He is infinitely greater, wiser, smarter, stronger, and many other things than we are. We can trust Him, because He loves us and has promised to never leave nor forsake His children.



Prayer for Renewal and Revival

Have you ever stopped to consider all the different parts of your body that have to work together in order for you to accomplish tasks? Take, for example, getting a bowl of cereal. Your muscles have to work in tandem with your bones, tendons, and ligaments in order to walk into the kitchen. Your ankle, knees, and hips join in on the process. Your eyes work with your hands and arms to take a bowl out of the cabinet and a spoon out of the drawer. Again, your elbows, shoulders, and wrists get involved. As you pour the cereal out of the box into the bowl, you are using your eyes and ears to know how much to pour. At this point, I have not mentioned your heart or your cardiovascular system, nor have I brought up your stomach and your digestive system. I have also left out your brain that is telling all these things to work, and your spine which is holding everything up.

I hope it is clear that there are a number of different things that have different jobs that must work together in order for you to accomplish even something as mundane as pouring a bowl of cereal. You probably do not think about each of these things because in all likelihood, the different parts of your body are doing their assigned task with excellence. You are not likely to think about any of this unless some part isn't working correctly. When that happens, you compensate for as long as you can. You put up with the pain or inconvenience. But you know, this is less than ideal.

I would like for you to stop and read 1 Corinthians 12:4-31. Notice that Paul uses the analogy of the body to describe the church. Allow the Scriptures to show you that while the body is called to be unified in serving Christ, that comes out in different ways. Not only is that good, it is on purpose.

It is not uncommon for us to look at other believers who are doing what God has called them to do with excellence and desire something similar in our lives. Paul is telling us here that we should rather rejoice that God has given them that ability, and be faithful in the things that the Lord has gifted us in. Rejoice that the Lord knows exactly which gifts to give you so that His body, the church, can have all that it needs to serve Him.

Allow the following to guide you as you pray:

- 1. Ask the Lord to help you to not be jealous of the gifts the Lord gave other believers.
- 2. Ask the Lord to show you any ways you are not encouraging unity in the body.
- 3. Thank God that He never changes. Thank Him because of His steadfastness your salvation is secure.
- 4. Ask the Lord for joy in serving Him and a joy when seeing others faithful serve too.
- 5. Ask that God would give you opportunities to serve others.
- 6. Ask the Lord to send revival and renewal to your life and the church you serve.
- 7. Pray that the Lord would help you show the love of Christ to others, especially those in the church.
- 8. Pray for the needs of the others on your team, yourself, and church (including your pastor and staff).
- 9. Pray that God would send more people to pray.
- 10. Pray that the Lord would extend the free gift of salvation to those in your community and family.
- 11. Pray that God would raise up church leaders and missionaries to labor in His fields.
- 12. Pray that the gospel would advance regardless of what is happening locally or globally.

Christmas Story (will be mailed to registering organizations)
Always include a copy of the Christmas Story

TOYS (At least 1 item): Small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, sidewalk chalk, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, Frisbee, card games such as Ol' Maid, Go Fish, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS (At least 2 items): Toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (boxed and in a plastic bag), shampoo (securely sealed & in a plastic bag) hairbrush, comb, pony tail holders, barrettes, hair clips, washcloth, etc.

OTHER (At least 2 items): Children's or Teen Bible (KJV, God's Word, or CSB version), age-appropriate Christian books, sunglasses, toy jewelry, watches, or flashlights (with extra batteries).

FOOD (At least 2 items): Canned food items with pop-tops (nothing which requires a can opener and no plastic containers), protein bars, hard candy (NO chocolate) and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, or gum.

(NO food items with peanut butter or nuts.)

CLOTHING (At least 2 items. All clothing items must be new with tags/packaging): T-shirts, underwear, socks, warm hat, gloves, scarf, ball cap, fleece pullover, warm outerwear, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: School supplies are welcome, but not all sites need school supplies. If you are partnering with a site, please check with the organization regarding the type of school supplies that are needed.

Additional Ideas to consider for older kids (11-17):

GIRLS: Lip gloss, costume jewelry, scarves, friendship bracelets, craft kits, card games, hand-held electronic games, journals, fun socks & slippers, doodle books, Spirograph kit, or feminine hygiene supplies.

BOYS: LEGOS®, card games, hand-held electronic games, journals, flashlights (with extra batteries), basketball, soccer ball, or NERF™ football.

Please do not include any food items that are perishable or can be easily crushed or opened while in transit.

Please do not include any knives.
