DOM Thoughts

Luke 17:3 Take heed to yourselves. If your brother sins against you, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him. 4 And if he sins against you seven times in a day, and seven times in a day returns to you, saying, 'I repent,' you shall forgive him." NKJV

Why did Jesus say this? Why is this even necessary if believers now have the Holy Spirit and can serve the Lord? Moreover, if this shouldn't happen, not even once, why even mention that it might happen at all, much less multiple times? Because it does. Just because you are saved doesn't mean you cease to be a free moral agent. And being a free moral agent means, you can choose to sin. So, not only does it happen, Jesus knew it was going to happen.

So, Jesus says to forgive others. If you are reading this, that truth probably isn't a surprise. In this verse, Jesus is not speaking of just any other person though. He is talking about believers. Unfortunately, some of them will sin against you. It ought not to happen, right? I mean, people shouldn't do those sorts of things to other people in the church, or so I have heard. It does happen, believers sin against one another. In a moment of confusion, anger, weakness, greed, some sort of moment where he or she is not seeking the will of the Lord, it happens. What then is our response? Speak with him or her, then forgive. And if it happens again, forgive again, even if it happens multiple times on the same day! That right there is the hard part for me because if I am honest, I want justice when it comes to other people's sins, especially those against me. But when it comes to my sins, I want grace.

I am just going to say, that I will speak with that person (the passage says "rebuke"), probably forgiving the first time without too much issue. Perhaps I would forgive the second time begrudgingly, but seven times? That seems a bit extreme, right?

Think about that time when you let your child push the shopping cart at the grocery store the first time, and he hit you in the ankles with it. You stop and have a "conversation," and he says "I'm really sorry." The second time it happens, you give him "the look," and he mouths "sorry." If you make it to the third time, what happens? Well, if you are like me, it isn't pretty. In all likelihood, following this infraction, I have just revoked his buggy driver's license, and he is following me around the store saying "I'm sorry, so sorry, please forgive me." While I am trying my best not to make a scene and complete my shopping.

Think about that time and realize, all too often even when dealing with other believers, you aren't the adult in that scenario, you're the child with the buggy. In those moments, you are going to want forgiveness. Even ask for it, for the fifth or sixth time that day.



Prayer for Renewal and Revival

When I was young, my mom would say, "I love you." I would say, "I love you," back to her. This is the expectation, is it not? That when someone says, "I love you," we express that in return. What if someone said, "I love you," then started the next sentence with the word "but"? Would that make you question whether the previous statement was indeed true? What if someone said "I love you," but never acted as if they loved you?

Later in my life, my mom would ask me to do things. Sometimes I would do things willingly. Sometimes, I would complain about having to do them. Looking back, they were never a big deal, I just didn't want to interrupt what I was doing, even if that was basically nothing. I remember one time my mother asked me (I am sure this happened more than once), "You know these things need to happen, why can't you do them because you love me and without being asked?" I do not recall my exact reply, but it was something like, "Just because I don't do them without being asked, doesn't mean I don't love you." Which sounded right to my teenage mind, but I was wrong.

On the night that Jesus was arrested, He celebrated the Passover meal with His disciples. John gives us the most detail from that night in his Gospel. In the midst of that night, Jesus gives one of the clearest statements on how to love Him that we find in Scripture. John 14:21 "He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him." Jesus then expounds upon this following a question from the other Judas. Please stop now and read John 14:23-15:25.

Jesus makes it clear in this passage that if we desire to show love to the Lord (Father, Son, and Spirit) we will learn and obey His commands. It is not enough to merely show appreciation for all that Jesus has done. It is not enough to hold the Lord in high regard. It is also not enough to say or sing "I love you." Allow me to be clear, this is not an issue that adds works (you doing something to earn your place in the family of God) to the salvation equation. Salvation is by grace, not works, the Bible makes this abundantly clear (Eph 2:8-9). Ephesians 2:10 tells us that ... "we are created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." In my mind, that sounds like obedience. Moreover, in the Great Commission that we find at the end of Matthew, Jesus tells us that as we make disciples, we teach them to observe all that He commanded us. Scripture is clear when it comes to loving God, obedience is a big part of the equation.

As you pray allow the following to guide you:

- 1. Thank the Lord for the teachings of Christ.
- 2. Thank the Lord for His perfect life, sacrificial death, and redemptive resurrection.
- 3. Ask the Lord to help you obey Him so that you might show Him that you love Him.
- 4. Ask the Lord to help you share about life in Christ with others in your family and daily life.
- 5. Ask the Lord to send revival and renewal (living water) to your life and the church you serve.
- 6. Pray that the Lord would help you show the love of Christ to others, especially those far from God.
- 7. Pray for the needs of the others on your team, yourself, and your church (including your pastor and staff).
- 8. Pray that God would send more people to pray.
- 9. Pray that the Lord would extend the free gift of salvation to those in your community and family.
- 10. Pray that God would raise up church leaders and missionaries to labor in His fields.
- 11. Pray that the gospel would advance regardless of what is happening locally or globally.
- 12. Pray that the Lord would show you ways that your personal obedience to Him can increase.
