

DOM Thoughts

Matthew 26:39b,42 ... "39b O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will... 42 Again, a second time, He went away and prayed, saying, "O My Father, if this cup cannot pass away from Me unless I drink it, Your will be done." NKJV

On the night of His betrayal and arrest, Christ takes His disciples to a familiar place to await what would happen. The place was a garden on the Mount of Olives. It was so familiar to Him and His disciples that Judas would soon know exactly where to lead those who would arrest Jesus. As He waits, He requests that His disciples pray. He goes a little further into the garden and does the same.

Jesus has known His entire life that this was a fixed point in time. Over and over again He has told those around Him that He would die and be raised on the third day. Over and over again He told His friends that He would be betrayed. Jesus knew this was that moment. Yet, even though He knew this was that moment, He still prays, "let this cup pass from Me." It wasn't a passing request either, He prays it in vs 39, 42, and it is implied in vs 44. Three times, Jesus asks the Father if there is another way. Each time Jesus would say that He would rather the Father's will be done, than His own. He knew that what He was about to endure would do something that no one had been able to do throughout history, restore what Adam had broken.

While we will not die as a sacrifice to restore a right relationship to God as Jesus did, for that was a once in eternity act. We sometimes see big things coming at us that we would rather not participate in. How many parents have asked the Lord to place an illness or an obstacle on their body instead of their child? How many of us have argued with God that we do not deserve the struggle or illness that we are about to endure? In those moments, we get a glimpse of what Jesus felt while praying in the garden.

The good news, believer, is that God is going to use this moment in your life to point others to Him. It might not happen exactly the way you want, pray, or expect. But may we join our Lord in praying, "Your will be done." We can trust that when the Lord's will is done, ultimately the best possible things will be a result.



Prayer for Renewal and Revival

What happens in your life around Easter? Does family come in from out of town, or do you go visit family? Do you go buy new Easter clothes? What about candy and other items that are only available this time of year? Laurie loves Brach's Easter Hunt Eggs. Each year since I have known her, she has searched high and low for this annual treat. As soon as the Valentine's Day Candy is off the shelf, she is looking for what may be her favorite candy of all time. Even when she discovered she had an allergy to yellow dye which knocks out the yellow, green, and orange eggs, she would still buy them looking for the packs that had the most blue, white, and purple eggs. Is there any doubt, for her, there is an air of expectation?

But it isn't just candy. The expectation of Easter, we now know, is what Jesus did there. He physically rose from the dead. When Jesus did that, those of us who place our faith and hope in Christ also rise from the dead, spiritually. The expectation is that through the work of Christ including His death, burial, and resurrection, the gates of heaven which were closed by Adam's sin, were now reopened. Please stop and read Luke 24:1-43. As you read, look at the expectations that the different people appear to express.

The women came prepared to embalm Jesus. The expectation was that He was still dead. In Mark, we see they also expected to have to figure out a way to roll the stone back from the tomb. Peter and John (John is found in the Gospel of John) ran to the tomb not knowing what to expect. The two on the road to Emmaus expected their common traveler would have heard of Jesus. The eleven probably never expected Jesus to appear in the midst of them.

What are you expecting this Easter? Are you expecting an early service, breakfast, and a late service? Are you expecting that God will draw men and women to Himself? That they will place their faith in Him? I thank the Lord that He does not have to submit to our expectations. But what if you looked forward to Easter with the expectation that God would do something amazing? Then, what if you regularly prayed with that sense of expectation? Don't quench the Holy Spirit. If He is moving, don't end this time because your hour is up. Let Him end this time in your life.

As you pray allow the following to guide you:

- 1. Thank the Lord for the renewed interest in the teachings of Christ.
- 2. Ask the Lord to give you and your team a sense of expectation for what He will do.
- 3. Thank the Lord for His perfect life, sacrificial death, and redemptive resurrection.
- 4. Ask the Lord to help you obey Him so that you might show Him and others that you love Him.
- 5. Ask the Lord to help you share about life in Christ with others in your family and daily life.
- 6. Ask the Lord to send revival and renewal (living water) to your life and the church you serve.
- 7. Pray that the Lord would help you show the love of Christ to others, especially those far from God.
- 8. Pray for the needs of the others on your team, yourself, and your church (including your pastor and staff).
- 9. Pray that God would send more people to pray.
- 10. Pray that the Lord would extend the free gift of salvation to those in your community and family.
- 11. Pray that God would raise up church leaders and missionaries to labor in His fields.
- 12. Pray that the gospel would advance regardless of what is happening locally or globally.
- 13. Pray that the Lord would show you ways that your personal obedience to Him can increase.
