

DOM Thoughts

1 Samuel 26:11 "The LORD forbid that I should stretch out my hand against the LORD's anointed. But please, take now the spear and the jug of water that are by his head, and let us go."

In 1 Samuel 26, we are told the account of David and Abishai sneaking into King Saul's camp at night. At this point in David's life, he has already been anointed King of Israel. He has already fought Goliath. but Saul was still sitting on the throne of Israel. Moreover, Saul was actively seeking to end David's life so that his heir, Jonathan, would be the next king. David, however, did not fight back. And when we find him in 1 Samuel 26, he had been on the run for quite some time.

Saul was tipped off that David was hiding in the hill of Hachilah and he went to find him. As the army of Saul slept, David and Abishai crept into the encampment and inside of King Saul's tent. There on the ground next to him was a spear. Abishai begged David to allow him to kill Saul right then and there, so this chase would be over. He even assumed that it was the Lord delivering Saul into David's hand. David, however, would not allow that to happen. He knew that it was the Lord's purview to end Saul's life when He so chose to do so. Instead, David decided to take the spear and a jug of water so that Saul would know that he could have killed him, but did not. Thus, proving that David did not desire harm to Saul like Saul did David. This is very similar to what David did when Saul stepped into a cave and David cut off a piece of his robe without him knowing.

This passage reminds me that God's ways are quite different from man's ways. I, too, have seen an opportunity to accomplish something that I think would be beneficial and assumed it was the Lord working things out for me. Unfortunately, I did not stop to ask God to give me wisdom on the matter. My assumption did not prove to be true and the result was not what I had hoped. If only I had shown patience like David.

I hope this passage will help you trust the Lord for wisdom in each and every situation you come to. That it will remind you not to assume that just because something looks one way, doesn't mean that is reality. Remember what James 1:5 tells us, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him."



Prayer for Renewal and Revival

As we continue to join our hearts in prayer for Renewal and Revival, my prayer is that we will not grow weary in this work. It is not easy work, yet it is Lord-honoring work. My continued prayer is that God would hear our prayers and act in His timing, for His glory, and I know we will reap the benefits of His action.

This month, I would like to encourage you to read Mark 8:27-38. Before you do, ask the Lord to lead you through His Word showing you the things He desires for you to see today. As you read, focus on the questions of Christ in this passage. Please do this before continuing to read this page.

I see two sets of related questions in this passage. The first set is "Who do men, and who do you say that I am?" The first question of this pair is, "what is the word on the street?" It isn't personal. There is no wrong answer to this question. Jesus simply wants the disciples to think about what people are saying about Him for a moment. The second part of this pair is personal. Jesus moves from "what have you heard?" to "what do you believe?" Peter responds correctly, "You are the Christ." Verses 31-33 indicate that Peter knew that Jesus is the Christ, but Peter didn't know what that meant for Jesus in the near future. Whereas Jesus didn't want those gathered to tell others that He is the Christ, He didn't have a problem with telling everyone that suffering was coming His way. The result of Peter rebuking Jesus over telling everyone He was going to suffer is that the one who privately and correctly called Him the Christ is now called Satan in front of everyone.

The second set of questions comes in a statement about what it costs to be a disciple of Christ. The point of these questions is, your soul is more important (valuable) than anything and everything on earth. That goes for everyone, not just the crowd gathered at that moment. He said to them, and He says to us if you want to follow me, deny yourself and take up the instrument of your death. In other words, if you are going to follow me, you have to follow me the whole way, no matter what it looks like. You can't say, I will follow the stuff that benefits me when I want to, and leave the stuff that hurts me or not follow when I don't want to. Jesus is saying, "If you want to follow me, you have to go the distance, or else you are not really following me."

As you finish, please continue in prayer for the following items:

- 1. Ask the Lord to help you deny yourself and follow Him.
- 2. Repent for those times you felt the Lord calling you to serve but chose not to serve.
- 3. Ask the Lord to show you when you are denying Him and not yourself.
- 4. Pray that the Lord will help you understand how His work in life, death, and resurrection should impact you and your relationship with Him and others.
- 5. Pray that the Lord would give you the strength to be in the center of His will daily.
- 6. Pray for the needs of the others on your team, yourself, and the church (including your pastor and staff).
- 7. Pray that the Lord would make this a sweet time that you would look forward to each month.
- 8. Pray that God would send more people to pray.
- 9. Pray that the Lord would extend the free gift of salvation to those in your community and family.
- 10. Pray that God would raise up church leaders and missionaries to labor in His fields.
- 11. Pray that no matter the circumstances, you will follow Jesus, and other believers will too.
- 12. Pray that the Lord will help you see that nothing is more valuable than your relationship with Him.



Hello friends of the Anchorage,

The cost to build is great, but the lives saved are worth every penny of the investment. You can trust the work of the Anchorage. For seventy years, we have seen lives changed, addictions broken and families restored.

There are three ways you can help:

- Join us in prayer that God's plan for this ministry will come to fruition. Help us spread the good news about this work with others.
- Consider how the Lord might lead you to give in support of this new facility. Our program is solely supported by individuals, churches, private business, and foundations.
- Look for opportunities to inform civic groups, churches, friends and neighbors about this vital ministry. Board members are happy to speak at events and answer any questions the community might have.

In Matthew 25:40, Jesus says "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me." The Anchorage serves as the hands and feet of Jesus, to bring long term care to those battling addiction. Your investment in the work of the Anchorage has eternal significance. We have already received over \$150,000 and look forward to reaching our goal as others know about this exciting opportunity.
