DOM Thoughts

Psalm 62:5 My soul, wait silently for God alone, For my expectation is from Him. 6 He only is my rock and my salvation; He is my defense; I shall not be moved. 7 In God is my salvation and my glory; The rock of my strength, And my refuge, is in God.

In the summer of 2004, our family attended a Reds baseball game. It was an exciting time because it was our oldest son's first game in person, and he was turning five that day. Something else had our attention that day as well. Ken Griffey Jr., had hit 499 home runs in his career and everyone in attendance that day was hoping to see history being made when he hit number 500. It was an afternoon game in mid-June, and the stadium was at near capacity. Each time Griffey approached the plate nearly 35,000 people stood to their feet, cameras ready... expecting to see a home run. We were prepared to witness history, and I even got a new digital camera for the trip with a zoom lens. The sense of expectation was so great that the people who remained seated when Griffey got to the plate were the unusual ones, I even noticed some getting funny looks, like, why aren't you standing?

In that moment it hit me like a ton of bricks, this is how every encounter I have with God ought to look. Every time I read the Scripture. Every time I pray. Every time I go to worship, I ought to have a sense of expectation. Why? Because, He is my salvation, my refuge, and my rock. If He is these things, then when I meet with Him, I ought to expect to hear from Him, through the Word, through the music, through the preaching of His Word.

Sadly, more times than I want to admit, I have left moments with the Lord not expecting to hear from Him, and having not heard from Him. I wish I could declare like the Psalmist that my expectation is from Him and my soul waits exclusively for Him, but I can't. Like the Hymn Writer, I must declare, "Prone to wander Lord I feel it, Prone to leave the one I love."

We did see a homerun that day, but Ken Griffey Jr did not hit it. As I recall, it was someone from the other team that knocked one out of the park. It should have been exciting to see it because it does take skill and strength to hit a home run against a major league pitcher, but since it wasn't Junior it was as if it didn't count. We left the park that day, somewhat disappointed that we didn't see history being made. We should have left that park thrilled that we had been able to cheer on our team and had the experience. I fear we often leave moments with God the same way. We were hoping to feel the ground shake or a booming voice from the Lord, instead, we got a gentle reminder to keep trusting and following, and we left disappointed because we didn't witness history being made.



Prayer for Renewal and Revival

It matters where you look. I admit, I have a problem with "Male Pattern Blindness". This is a condition that seems to especially impact individuals with one X and Y chromosome. They can look right at something, and not see it. I hope I am not the only one this has happened to. I ask Laurie, my wife, where something is. She replies that it is in the pantry, on the second shelf. I look in the said pantry, on said shelf, and I cannot find said item! Finally, in my frustration, I plead with Laurie to come look. She walks in, and seemingly without looking, puts her hand on what I am looking for. It was as if it was camouflaged from my view in some way.

This morning, I saw a video from a Police Car's Dash Cam. An officer had pulled a car over and was standing at the passenger window speaking to the driver. All of a sudden, an SUV clips the side of the car, knocking the stopped car into the officer. The SUV begins to roll over in the distance. The driver of the SUV was distracted by texting and driving. It matters where you look.

In the third chapter of the Gospel of John, we find someone looking for something. Nicodemus comes to Jesus at night looking for answers as to how Jesus could do the miracles He did. As you stop and read John 3:1-21 note the phrases that deal with sight (see, look, marvel). Then ask yourself, "Where did Jesus tell Nicodemus to look?" Also ask, "Why was Nicodemus having difficulty seeing?" and, "What is the remedy Jesus gives him?"

Now that you have studied this passage, if you are not familiar with the part about Moses and the Serpent, look up Numbers 21 and read about the circumstances behind this reference. The Israelites had cried out for salvation from the poisonous snakes. They wanted God to make them go away. They desired that the snake bites would no longer be an issue. God did not take away the bites or the poison. He just made a way for the poison to not kill. In the same way, Jesus does not take away the sting of sin, nor the earthly consequences of them either. However, what He did (life, teachings, cross, resurrection) will take away the eternal death of those sins if we place our faith in the work He did.

As you finish, please continue in prayer for the following items:

- 1. Ask the Lord to help you look in the right places.
- 2. Ask the Lord to help you remember that His timing is perfect, every time.
- 3. Thank God that He is always working things out for good for those who love and trust in Him.
- 4. Pray that the Lord will help you understand how His work in life, death, and resurrection should impact you and your relationship with Him and others.
- 5. Ask that the Lord would help you delight in His will, and not the things of this world.
- 6. Pray that the Lord will give you the strength to be in the center of His will daily.
- 7. Pray for the needs of the others on your team, yourself, and the church (including your pastor and staff).
- 8. Pray that the Lord would make this a sweet time that you would look forward to each month.
- 9. Pray that God would send more people to pray.
- 10. Pray that the Lord would extend the free gift of salvation to those in your community and family.
- 11. Pray that God would raise up church leaders and missionaries to labor in His fields.
- 12. Pray that the Lord will help you see that nothing is more valuable than your relationship with Him.
